MEDICAID BENEFICIARIES:

Fair Hearings

Notice to Medicaid Beneficiaries appealing reductions or denials of Medicaid-funded health services or Medicaid eligibility and who missed or will miss their Medicaid fair hearing (or need more time to prepare for their hearing) due to Harvey.

According to Texas Medicaid's Appeals Division, any Medicaid fair hearings that have been dismissed where the appellant resides in a disaster area will be automatically reopened and rescheduled. Also, any Medicaid fair hearings scheduled within the next two weeks, for those residing in the disaster areas, and do not appear for their fair hearing will automatically be rescheduled rather than dismissed. If you are or should be receiving continued services (or continued eligibility) pending the appeal process, those services or eligibility should remain continued until the fair hearing is held, and a decision is issued. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

SNAP recipients in the affected counties will see their September benefits automatically loaded today, Sept. 1, onto their Lone Star Cards. Normally benefits are staggered among recipients throughout the first half of the month. With this change, Texas will issue \$160 million in benefits early to more than 600,000 SNAP households in counties affected by Hurricane Harvey.

Saturday, Sept. 2, SNAP recipients in the affected counties will see a percentage of their August benefits automatically added to their Lone Star Cards to replace food that was lost during the storm. With this change, Texas will issue replacement benefits to more than 716,000 SNAP households in the affected counties.

There is no action required by the recipient to receive either of these additional benefits.

You can receive hot food using your EBT card

Retailers that normally accept SNAP benefits were told to allow purchases of hot and prepared foods. If you tried to purchase hot or prepared food items at one of these retailers and were denied, please send the name and location of the retailer to Lone Star Business Services by calling (512) 206-4748 or by emailing LoneStar@hhsc.state.tx.us.

Receive a replacement EBT card?

If you get SNAP or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and need a replacement EBT card due to the card being lost or destroyed, you can get a new card two ways.

If you do not have access to mail, you can get a new card at a local office. You can call 2-1-1 and select Option 2 to find the closest local office to you.

If you have access to mail, you can call the Lone Star Help Desk at 1-800-777-7EBT (1-800-777-7328) and a new card will be mailed to you.

Payments by Paper Check Delivered by the US Postal Service

Hurricane Harvey's impact on the Gulf Coast resulted in the temporary suspension of mail delivery service, as well as the closure of some postal facilities in the Houston area. The U.S. Postal Service is providing additional information on how customers displaced by Hurricane Harvey can retrieve checks they receive via the mail.

Payments by Direct Deposit

Nearly all payments issued by direct deposit will arrive as scheduled. If a person's payment is delayed, they should contact their financial institution. If the financial institution is not operating, please see the "emergency payment" information below.

Payments by Direct Express Debit Card

A Treasury Department program: For recipients in the affected areas who receive their payment through a Direct Express card, fees will be waived, even if they have evacuated out of the area. Payments will be posted to Direct Express cards on September 1.
