Subj: (U) COMMARFORRES MOBILIZATION AND FORCE ACTIVATION PLAN

1. (U) Purpose. This supporting PLAN satisfies the current Joint Strategic Capabilities Plan (JSCP), Service Mobilization Management Plan (MPLAN) taskings, Marine Corps Strategy 21, and provides necessary policy. This PLAN also establishes required procedures to support both the rapid activation and deployment of SMCR units (i.e., personnel and equipment) from approximately 180 Reserve Training Centers (RTC) to their gaining force commander(s) (GFC), plus individual Marine¹ reserves during a declared operation or contingency to meet specific unit and/or individual Time Phased Force Deployment Data (TPFDD) timeline within the Force Deployment Planning and Execution (FDP&E) process.

2. (U) Scope. SMCR unit and individual Marine reserve activation requires detailed FDP&E, focused training with the appropriate GFC, and adroit execution. This PLAN establishes those mission essential tasks and force activation procedures for COMMARFORRES; CG, 4th Marine Division (MarDiv); CG, 4th Marine Aircraft Wing (MAW); CG, 4th Force Service Support Group (FSSG); and CG, Marine Corps Reserve Support Command (MCRSC) to meet the O/CONPLAN TPFDD concept of operations.

3. (U) Cancellation. ForO 3060 COMMARFORRES Mobilization Management Plan of 28 Nov 00.

4. (U) Background. SMCR unit and individual Marine reserve activation planning takes place during every phase of deliberate planning or crisis action planning (CAP). SMCR unit and individual Marine reserve activation is a subset of the overall U.S. Marine Corps Force Deployment Planning and Execution (FDP&E) process described in the Marine Corps Planners Manual. The capability of COMMARFORRES to activate units when directed by CMC (PP&O) and to recall individual Marine reserves when directed by CMC (MFP-60) is an operational imperative. The procedures contained within this PLAN amplify policies and procedures contained within the current Marine Corps Mobilization Management Plan (USMC MPLAN), Joint Doctrine, and other Service orders and directives. During FDP&E, the CMC may direct changes or modifications to established Marine Corps policies to facilitate the rapid activation of SMCR units and individuals to support the GFC warfighting requirements. COMMARFORRES as a supporting commander should expect such

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changes during the execution of any Major Theater of War (MTW) or Smaller-Scale Contingency (SSC) O/CONPLAN with its dynamic IPFDD validation process.
Subj: (U) COMMARFORRES MOBILIZATION AND FORCE ACTIVATION PLAN

5. (U) Information. This PLAN is one comprehensive volume intended to be used during the mobilization and force activation by the COMMARFORRES Staff and Force units; CG, 4th MarDiv; CG, 4th MAW; CG, 4th FSSG; and CG, MCRSC. It contains those actions and mission essential tasks to be accomplished when activation is required to support an operation or declared contingency. This PLAN, along with other relevant documents shown in this basic plan will facilitate the rapid response of activated SMCR units and individuals reporting to their GFC(s) to execute the mission of that MAGTF.

6. (U) Action. The MARFORRES staff, MSC Commanding Generals, Commanding Officers, and Officers in Charge, will disseminate the contents of this PLAN for implementation and ensure compliance prior to and during the time of execution.

7. (U) Recommendation. Recommendations concerning this PLAN are invited and should be submitted to the Commander, Marine Forces Reserve (Attention: AC/S G-5) via the chain of command.

8. (U) JSCP. This PLAN will be updated at the next JSCP Cycle.

9. (U) Reserve Applicability. This PLAN is applicable to the Marine Corps Reserve.

10. (U) Certification. Reviewed and approved this date.

40 1. (U) Situation

41
42 a. (U) General

43
44 (1) (U) This PLAN supports reference (a) and satisfies references
45 (b) through (i). This PLAN is designed to support the rapid activation of
46 the Marine Corps Reserve, to include SMCR units and Pre-trained Individual
47 Manpower (PIM) and ensure their efficient reception and force integration for
48 the reinforcement and/or augmentation of any GFC. Inherent in this is the
49 mission essential task to support the GFC Time Phased Forces Deployment Data
50 (TPFDD) timeline for any level of activation from a smaller-scale contingency
51 (SSC) to a major theater war (MTW).
52

53 (2) (U) This PLAN is directive and applicable to all of MARFORRES to
54 include its major subordinate commands (MSC): 4th Marine Division, 4th
55 Marine Aircraft Wing, 4th Force Service Support Group, and Marine Corps
56 Reserve Support Command.

1 (3) (U) Reference (j) is the source publication for terms and
2 definitions.

3
4 b. (U) Area of Concern

5
6 (1) (U) Area of Interest. COMMARFORRES reports directly to the CMC,
7 per Title 10, and is responsible for the training, organization, and
8 equipping of the units within the SMCR, and management/administration of the
9 PIM. COMMARFORRES, via the Forces For Unified Combatant Commanders (Forces
10 For), has assigned operational SMCR units to USJFCOM per reference (k). When
11 directed by the CMC, COMMARFORRES activates SMCR units, or detachments of
12 units, to reinforce and augment the active component. COMMARFORRES units are
13 located at approximately 180 Reserve Training Centers (RTC) throughout the
14 contiguous U.S. (CONUS), Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico. Also, COMMARFORRES
15 has command authority over the mobilization processing of the PIM at
16 approximately 30 Initial Mobilization Processing Center (IMPC) locations
17 throughout the contiguous 48 states. (See Figure 1.)

23 (2) (U) Area of Potential Operations. Activated SMCR units and
24 individuals will be deployed per the appropriate O/CONPLAN with TPFDD to
25 reinforce and/or augment the supported MARFOR component of a CINC during a




Figure 2 - Area of Potential Operations

26 declared contingency, disaster or operation. (See Figure 2.)

c. (U) Enemy Forces. Annex B (Intelligence) of the appropriate O/CONPLAN)

d. (U) Friendly Forces

(1) (U) MARFORRES' operational center of gravity is its ability to activate and meet the appropriate O/CONPLAN TPFDD timeline. The tactical center of gravity is ready and deployable SMCR units and individual Marine reservists capable of mission execution.

(2) (U) Higher

(a) (U) NATIONAL COMMAND AUTHORITY (NCA). The NCA is the highest authority that directs the nation's military--including mobilization. The National Security Council (NSC) at the direction of the President establishes national security emergency preparedness policy, normally by means of an Executive Order that assigns emergency preparedness responsibilities, including mobilization, to the DOD and other Federal departments and agencies.

(b) (U) OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE (OSD). In time of crisis and/or declared war, OSD assists the Secretary of Defense in managing force activation by developing implementing guidance for issuance by the Secretary of Defense to the Joint Staff, Military Departments, and Defense agencies. OSD assembles cost data and compiles reports on the costs of military operations, as required by law.

(c) (U) COMMANDANT OF THE MARINE CORPS (CMC). When directed by the National Command Authority (NCA), provides both AC/RC units and individual augments to the supported CINC's MARFOR. CMC shall direct COMMARFORRES to activate SMCR units in support of O/CONPLAN IAW the TPFDD being executed. Activated SMCR units will be provided to MARFOR(s) via USCINCFJCOM. Other tasks include:

1 1 (U) Provides trained and equipped forces to the
2 supported COMMARFOR for further deployment to the appropriate theater.

3
4 2 (U) Provides requisite guidance for personnel
5 replacement and activation of reserve augmenting/reinforcing forces.

6
7 3 (U) Provides funding or supplemental funding to support
8 the requirements of the supported CINC.

9
10 4 (U) Authorizes the use of prepositioned war reserve
11 assets in support of the OPLAN.

12
13 5 (U) Coordinates with the CNO for the activation of Navy
14 augments and funding.

15
16 6 (U) Coordinates with the Joint Staff for the PRC and all
17 levels of activation of both SMCR units and individual Marine reservists.

18
19 7 (U) Directs Commander, Marine Corps Bases East and
20 Commander, Marine Corps Bases Pacific to:

21
22 a (U) Support movement of deploying forces within
23 capabilities.

24
25 b (U) Direct the activation of Mobilization Support
26 Battalions (MSB), which include the Mobilization Processing Centers (MPC), to
27 assist incoming Reserve personnel in the orderly accession to their gaining
28 command or Combat Replacement Company (CRC).

29
30 c (U) Provide post-mobilization training and support
31 for the CRCs.

32
33 8 (U) Directs COMMARFORRES to activate Selected Marine
34 Corps Reserve (SMCR) units in support of appropriate O/CONPLAN in accordance
35 with Annex A and its TPPDD.

36
37 (d) (U) CHIEF OF NAVAL OPERATIONS (CNO). Responsible for the
38 planning, recruiting, training, equipping and activation of both the regular
39 and reserve Navy. These functions are executed through various CNO
40 directorates and are explained in reference (k).

41
42 1 (U) Activates appropriate Navy Mobilization Processing
43 Sites (NMPS) to support the activation of recalled Navy Reserve Program 9
44 personnel assigned to SMCR units. See Appendix 4 (Navy Reserve Program 9
45 Personnel) to Annex E (Personnel).

46
47 2 (U) Issues orders to activate Medical Augmentation
48 Personnel (MAP).

49
50 3 (U) Instructs BUMED to activate Program 49 (Field
51 Hospitals) and Program 32 (Military Treatment Facilities (MTF)) personnel.

52
53 (e) (U) COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF, U.S. TRANSPORTATION COMMAND
54 (CINCUSTRANSCOM)

55
56 1 (U) Serves as the single manager for the planning and
57 operations for transportation.

1
2 2 (U) Provides intra-CONUS/OCONUS transportation to
3 move/deploy personnel, unit equipment, and non-unit related cargo. Movement
4 priorities will be derived from the required delivery dates (RDD) established
5 in the supported CINC's validated TPFDD.

6
7 (f) (U) COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF, U.S. JOINT FORCES COMMAND
8 (CINCUSJFCOM)

9
10 1 (U) Functions as the joint force provider to the
11 appropriate supported CINC.

12
13 2 (U) COMMARFORLANT is the Marine Component to USJFCOM
14 assigned with the tasks shown in reference (m).

15
16 3 (U) Issues the Deployment Order for II MEF units and
17 activated SMCR units.

18
19 (g) (U) SUPPORTED CINC(S). Supported commanders are tasked in
20 the JSCP or by other joint operation planning authority to prepare specific
21 plans in their respective areas of responsibility. They specify the level of
22 mobilization needed to support the plan; identify time-phased requirements
23 for RC forces; and identify the RC forces needed for reinforcement,
24 deployment and movement of the force, and for backfill of deployed units.
25 This planning establishes the requirements for forces and sustaining
26 resources upon which supporting plans are based. This planning requires
27 extensive coordination among the supported commander, supporting commanders,
28 and the Services. Supported commanders request invocation of emergency
29 mobilization/force activation authorities when ordered to execute operation
30 orders (OPORDs) requiring RC units/forces.

31
32 (3) (U) Adjacent

33
34 (a) (U) COMMANDER, U.S. MARINE FORCES ATLANTIC (COMMARFORLANT).
35 As the U.S. Marine Corps Component Commander to CINCUSJFCOM, COMMARFORLANT
36 shall transfer OPCON and admin of activated SMCR units/detachments to their
37 appropriate GFC.

38
39 1 (U) Requests COMMARFORRES report for planning during the
40 JSCP deliberate planning cycle to appropriate MARFORLANT responsible PLAN.

41
42 2 (U) Deploys forces in support of appropriate OPLAN in
43 accordance with Annex A and its TPFDD.

44
45 3 (U) Provides strategic/operational level sustainment
46 support for appropriate O/CONPLAN as directed.

47
48 4 (U) Prepares to receive and distribute SMCR unit
49 authorized allowance (A/A) equipment of gained SMCR units, previously shipped
50 from MARCORMATCOM.

51
52 5 (U) Provides force deployment logistics support and
53 manages II MEF's Remain Behind Equipment (RBE) with the support of the 4th
54 FSSG provided CSSD. This CSSD shall conduct maintenance, prepare equipment
55 for deployment, and when directed, deploy RBE to the supported MARFOR. This
56 CSSD may also be tailored to provide logistics support during force
57 deployment operations.

1
2 (b) (U) COMMANDER, U.S. MARINE FORCES PACIFIC (COMMARFORPAC).
3 As the U.S. Marine Corps Component Commander to CINCUSPACOM, will exercise
4 operational control (OPCON) over its assigned forces (active, gained active,
5 and gained activated SMCR units).
6

7 1 (U) Requests COMMARFORRES report for planning during the
8 JSCP deliberate planning cycle to appropriate MARFORPAC plans.
9

10 2 (U) Deploys forces in support of appropriate OPLAN in
11 accordance with Annex A and its TPFDD.
12

13 3 (U) Provides logistical support for appropriate
14 O/CONPLAN as directed.
15

16 4 (U) Prepares to receive unit T/A and distribute SMCR
17 A/A delta to gained SMCR units, previously shipped from MARCORMATCOM.
18

19 5 (U) Identifies and manages I and III MEF's Remain Behind
20 Equipment (RBE) with the support of the 4th FSSG provided CSSD. This CSSD
21 shall conduct maintenance, prepare equipment for deployment, and, when
22 directed, deploy RBE to the supported MARFOR.
23

24 6 (U) Requests COMMARFORRES identify and TPFDD a reserve
25 regiment to perform component level Marine rear area operations coordination.
26

27 (c) (U) COMMANDER, NAVAL RESERVE FORCES (COMNAVRESFOR).
28 Directs and coordinates the activation of subordinate units and individuals.
29 COMNAVRESFOR serves additional duty as Director of Naval Reserve, CNO (N095).
30 Other tasks include:
31

32 1 (U) Issues activation orders to recalled Navy Reserve
33 Program 9 (NRP9) personnel assigned to activated SMCR units.
34

35 2 (U) Coordinates with COMMARFORRES for the TPFDD of NRP9
36 personnel.
37

38 (d) (U) COMMANDING GENERAL, MARINE CORPS COMBAT DEVELOPMENT
39 COMMAND (CG, MCCDC)
40

41 1 (U) Develops and provides doctrine for operational
42 employment to Marine forces in support of appropriate OPLAN.
43

44 2 (U) Develops individual refresher training for Combat
45 Replacement Companies (CRCs).
46

47 (e) (U) COMMANDER, MARINE CORPS MATERIEL COMMAND
48 (COMMARCORMATCOM)
49

50 1 (U) Manages the Marine Corps War Reserve Program.
51

52 2 (U) Sources SMCR unit A/A delta as requested by the GFC.
53

54 3 (U) Confirms sustainment requirements from I, II, and
55 III MEF's War Reserve Withdrawal Plans filed in support of appropriate
56 O/CONPLAN and provides sourcing information to appropriate MARFOR during
57 execution of O/CONPLAN.

1
2 4 (U) Coordinates the time phased movement of sustainment
3 requirements to theater to support OPLAN with USTRANSCOM via the appropriate
4 COMMARFOR.

5
6 5 (U) Identifies sustainment shortfalls to CMC and
7 appropriate COMMARFOR as confirmed by Defense Logistics Agency.

8
9 6 (U) Provides assistance in the planning and development
10 of retail Class V(W) sourcing to appropriate MEF for prepositioned war
11 reserve, and develops wholesale sourcing plans for the balance of 60-Days of
12 Ammunition (DOA) mount-out stocks.

13
14 7 (U) Coordinates with CMC (ASL-30) for the consolidation
15 of Class V(A) movements.

16
17 8 (U) Provides assistance in accelerating fielding of
18 selected material.

19
20 9 (U) Through CO, Marine Corps Tactical Systems Support
21 Activity, provides general and specialized software support for ADPE.

22
23 10 (U) Coordinates the sourcing of Class V(A) with
24 appropriate MARFOR.

25
26 (f) (U) COMMANDING GENERAL, MARINE RECRUITING COMMAND.
27 Provides Prior Service Recruiters to backfill Marine Reserve Training Centers
28 upon stop-loss.

29
30 e. (U) Attachments and Detachments. None.

31
32 f. (U) Assumptions

33
34 (1) (U) The CINC will initiate Flexible Deterrent Options (FDO)
35 which will include request for PRC.

36
37 (2) (U) PRC will equal C Day.

38
39 (3) (U) CJCS and CINCUSJFCOM Deployment Order will support the
40 movement of SMCR unit equipment and personnel to meet the TPFDD timeline.
41 Also, CINCUSTRANSCOM (MTMC) will provide transportation to support SMCR
42 unit/cargo TPFDD movement requirements.

43
44 (4) (U) CMC activation order will support SMCR activation
45 requirements.

46
47 (5) (U) SIPRNET connectivity will be adequate to support the force
48 deployment execution process.

49
50 (6) (U) Gaining Force Commanders will not have NEC or STAP available
51 for issue for the deploying unit commander (DUC).

52
53 (7) (U) Both SIPRNET and NIPRNET will be attacked which may degrade
54 both systems.

55
56 (8) (U) MARFORRES deliberate planning must include the assumption
57 that the supported MARFOR/Warfighting MEF may deploy forces from multiple

1 A/SPOE. Both San Diego, CA, and Morehead City and Willington, NC, may be
2 used as sea ports of embarkation (SPOE) to deploy unit cargo to the theater
3 of operation. MCAS Miramar and MCAS Cherry Point can be used as PAX aerial
4 ports of embarkation APOEs. Also, the GFC's aerial ports of embarkation
5 (APOE) may be the aerial port of debarkation (APOD) for activated Reserve
6 units arriving from their point of origin (i.e., the Reserve Training Center
7 (RTC)). In some cases, the MARFORRES's unit's APOD will also be their APOE
8 for theater.

9
