Subj: FOOT PROTECTION

1. Purpose. To provide guidance for specific occupations and work places within Marine Forces Reserve (MARFORRES) where personnel shall be required to wear foot protection.

2. Cancellation. ForO 5100.8.

3. Background. The references direct that personnel engaged in foot hazardous operation shall be issued approved foot protection and shall wear foot protection for their particular work area or occupation.

4. Action

a. Foot hazardous area identification shall be made at the unit level, with the assistance and advice of the Ground Safety Manager. In aviation units, the Aircraft Maintenance Officer will be guided by the references and shall make recommendations for designating foot hazardous areas with the Aircraft Maintenance Department.

b. Once identified, all designated foot hazardous areas shall be conspicuously marked as such.

c. Although not all inclusive, the following list of typical work areas and occupations should be used as a guide in determining foot hazardous areas:

Electric Shop	Packaging & Preservation
Heavy Equipment Repair	Utilities
Liquid Fuel Distribution	Warehousing and Shop Stores
Materials Handling	Flight Line/Hangar Deck
Mechanical Shops	All Aircraft Maintenance Work Spaces
Ordnance Storage/Build-up	Battery Shop



Automotive Equipment Operator	Electrician
Automobile Mechanic	Heavy Duty Equipment
Machinist	Mechanic
Ordnance Handler	High Lift Truck Operator
Carpenter	Plumber/Welder
Truck Driver	Sheetmetal Worker
Plane Captain	Aircraft Mechanic

d. The approved general safety boot is available through the supply system. Please note, when ordering safety footwear, that each size and type of footwear has an NSN assigned. Aircrews should continue to use the approved flight boot per reference (c). Liquid oxygen personnel shall continue to use the approved Lox boot which is available through the supply system.

e. Purchasing of approved safety boots shall be accomplished in one of two ways: for ground related jobs/MOS's, the ground supply office shall be utilized. For aviation related jobs/MOS's the aviation supply office shall be used.

5. Reserve Applicability. This Order is applicable to the Marine Corps Reserve.
