


IRR MEMBER REQUIREMENTS

- UPDATE CURRENT ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBERS
- NOTIFY MCIRSA OF CHANGES IN HEALTH, MARITAL STATUS, NUMBER OF DEPENDENTS, OR EMPLOYMENT STATUS
- COMPLETE A REPORT OF MEDICAL HISTORY EVERY 2 YEARS
- MAINTAIN UNIFORMS AND RESERVE ID CARD
- ATTEND MUSTERS WHEN NOTIFIED
- MAINTAIN HEIGHT AND WEIGHT
- ADHERE TO STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

WHAT'S A MUSTER
AN ADMINISTRATIVE FORMATION CONDUCTED TO ASSESS THE STRATEGIC MOBILIZATION CAPABILITY OF THE IRR.
