



Sexual Assault Response Coordinators (SARCs), SAPR VAs, and Uniformed Victim Advocates (UVAs) will be notified when the new version is available.

SAPR Monthly Snapshots aim to give Marines awareness of sexual assault in the Corps. The data is subject to change and will not be finalized or official until release of the DOD Annual Report on Sexual Assault in the Military (expected Apr/May).

The below charts present an analysis of the SAPR 8-Day Briefs completed in the 1st Quarter (Q1) of Fiscal Year 2015 (FY15) (Oct 2014 to Dec 2014), compared to data from FY14 SAPR 8-Day Briefs. The victim’s commander is required to complete a SAPR 8-Day Brief for each Unrestricted Report filed.

Most At-Risk Populations (FY15 Q1 compared to FY14)




Reported Incidents. Reporting provides a bridge to victim care and offender accountability. All data in this table is current as of 1 Mar 2015.




