Our battalion's lineage is forged in combat. We stand on the shoulders of Sailors and Marines who fought in four major operations during World War 2. This battalion repelled Banzai charges on Saipan and landed on Iwo Jima as part of the first assault wave. 3/25 fought through the streets of Iraq in 2005 and went toe to toe with the Taliban in Afghanistan in 2010.  - **Fighting Spirit.** We foster a command climate where Marines are inspired to come to drill. We train and fight with passion. Teamwork and mutual respect are in everything we do.
 - Trust. Leaders establish trust through their proficiency, personal example, and genuine care for their people. A team that trusts each other implicitly can learn, adapt, and succeed in the chaos of war.
 - Accountability. We are accountable for our people, our equipment, and our actions. Warriors take care of their weapons and equipment. We are accountable for the moral, physical, and mental wellness of our Marines. Marines with successful civilian lives are stronger on the battlefield.
- 3. **READY TO MOBILIZE, FIGHT, AND WIN.** Everything we do is about increasing our readiness to mobilize for a deployment and our combat effectiveness to fight and win in battle.
 - Train hard. Our leaders design and implement challenging, realistic training that is rewarding and gives the Marines the experience they joined to be a part of. We maximize training time, complete enduring mobilization readiness tasks, and maintain a focus on combat effectiveness.
