
BANG FOR THE BUCK



ACTIVE COMPONENT

At 39,600, Marine Forces Reserve comprises just 16.4% of the Marine Corps' Total Force end strength for only ~5% of the budget.

MFR provides all of the Marine Corps' Civil Affairs Groups (CAGs)*, the only Intel Support Battalion (ISB) and 100% of the Corps' Personnel Retrieval and Processing (PRP) capability.
